High Rise Fire Safety

Grenfell Tower: 72 dead

- Newport has 17 high-rises, none residential so far
- US 2009-2013: 14500 high rise fires, 520 injuries, 40 deaths

1. Before: Have a Plan

Know your building - escape routes, fire equipment. Know your floor - people with special needs, consider floor warden Be aware of what the fire alarm sounds like. Have a designated meeting place for employees or residents.

Make sure fire doors stay closed and are not blocked.

Make sure fire equipment (hoses etc.) are operable and not blocked.

2. Locate Fire and Decide to Stay or Go

If the fire is above you, probably should go. If the fire is below you, it may be safer to stay. If not sure where the fire is call 911 and ask.

Check the door (back of hand) for heat. If it's hot, then stay.

3. Don't Panic

Call 911 and tell them where you are and what your plan is, even if you see firefighters. If you stay:

- Block smoke with wet towels, door and vents.
- Open a window but don't break it in case you need to close it again.
- Stay by a window and signal with light or sheet so people know you're there.
- Be patient, it may be hours before they reach you.

If you go:

- Brace door with your body, open a crack and check for smoke or fire.
- If you don't hear the alarm, pull the nearest fire alarm.
- Don't go up. If you can't go down, shelter in place.
- Take your key in case you need to retreat.
- If you see any smoke, stay low, consider retreating.
- Test any door you encounter for heat before opening it.
- Make sure fire doors close behind you.
- Don't use elevators
- Move swiftly but safely down the stairs
- Don't jump

Listen to first responders and do what they say.

4. Afterwards

After you are out, STAY OUT

Report to the designated meeting place.

Notify responders if you are aware of anyone still in the building. Take a head count.

Only re-enter when the fire department tells you it's safe.

Organize (CERT?) to help people find shelter or return for their belongings

Highway 91 Revisited - Dealing with Mass Casualties

Active Shoot Update - Run, Hide, Fight

Barricade the door - use your body (laying down) if necessary Don't hide in the bathroom unless the door is barricaded As a last resort - resist! Shooters often give up after minimal resistance.

Route 91 (Las Vegas) Shooting

11 minutes, 58 dead, 851 insured
22,000 people attended the event
Majority of injuries were from trampling, not gunshots.
Very difficult to identify the source of the shooting
Much confusion and misinformation - multiple shooters etc
UCM - level 1 trauma center erroneously reported full 1 hour after attack (104 patients)
Sunrise - level 2 trauma - 199 patients, 150 in 40 minutes
STOP the BLEED - death toll would have been much higher without tourniquets

Key Messages

Don't panic - even in a shooting - think before you run Bodies are resilient if they don't bleed out - officer treated 4 hours after gunshot

Infectious Diseases - Influenza (flu), Measles, Norovirus

Flu still very active. More severe strain propagating. Get a flu shot! Measles high infectious. Vaccinated children less likely to get autism. Pertussis booster recommended Norovirus - highly contagious - food born - watch for institutional cover-up

Hand washing is among the best protections.Don't prepare food if you are infected.Wash clothing of infected people thoroughly
