





COVID-19 Global Data




COVID 19: US Data





COVID-19: New Information

Prevention

- As before: hand washing, disinfect
- Face masks reduce spreading (somewhat) show courtesy to others
- Transmission primarily person to person
 - Typically within 6 feet
 - · Coughs, sneezes or talks
 - People may be asymptomatic
- Enclosed spaces are highest risk

Risks

- As before: age, underlying conditions: heart, lung, diabetes
- Hospitals, physicians are now relatively low risk because of preparation
- Blood type A does worse, blood type O does somewhat better

Symptoms


- As before: coughing, fever, shortness of breath, etc
- Also: loss of taste/smell, headache, sore throat
- Also: congestion/runny nose, nausea, diarrhea
- Emergency: trouble breathing, chest pain or pressure, new confusion
- Emergency: inability to wake or stay awake, bluish lips or face


COVID 19: More New Information

- Disease course / treatment
 - As before: home care, hospital for breathing issues
 - Testing now widely available consult with doctor
 - When you can be around others:
 - 3 days with no fever
 - · Symptoms improved
 - 10 days since symptoms appeared
 - 2 negative tests 24 hours apart (if available)
 - Positive test but no symptoms
 - Isolate 10 days since positive test
 - 2 negative tests 24 hours apart (if available)
 - Immunocompromised: consult physician
 - Remdesivir
 - Shortens hospitalization from 14 to 11 days
 - Short supplies rationed for sickest people
 - Hydroxychloroquine
 - No evidence of benefit or prevention
 - Significant risk of heart arrhythmias
 - Many other drugs / treatments in development / test
- Vaccine
 - More than 120 vaccines in development
 - 3 phase three trials starting this summer
 - Vaccine not likely this year



- · Harassing Phone Calls
 - If you have been the victim of harassing calls and do **not** know the person who is calling, you can use this system to make a report.
 - After completing your report, please contact your phone service provider (as noted on your telephone bill) with the report number you receive at the end of this process. Follow your phone service provider's instructions and keep track of when calls occur and the caller's phone number (if you have caller ID).

0	Check Fraud (\$1000 and above)	The act of presenting a forged or altered check in the amount of \$1000 and above in exchange for money, goods, or services.	"A person changes the payee name on a check not issued to them and the amount of \$1000 and above, ar deposits it into their bank account.
0	Check Fraud (\$999 and below)	The act of presenting a forged or altered check in the amount of \$999 and below in exchange for money, goods, or services.	A person changes the payee name a check not issued to them and in amount of \$999 and below, and deposits it into their bank account
0	Credit Card Fraud (\$1000 and above)	Unauthorized use of credit card information for the purpose of charging purchases to the account or removing funds from it in the amount of \$1000 and above.	An unknown person obtained your credit card information and made charges on your account in the amount of \$1000 and above.
0	Credit Card Fraud (\$999 and below)	Unauthorized use of credit card information for the purpose of charging purchases to the account or removing funds from it in the amount of \$999 and below.	An unknown person obtained you credit card information and made charges on your account in the amount of \$999 and below.
0	Custody/Visitation Court Order Violation	A child is not dropped off or picked up on time as outlined in a court order.	A parent is late dropping off a chilt the end of their visitation period. WARNING: Do not use this for a missing child, or a child abduction restraining order violations.
0	Harassing Phone Call	Unwanted phone calls of an annoying, harassing or threatening nature. If you know or think you may know the person making the calls, you must call the Police Department at (949) 644-3681 to file your report.	Immediate hang-ups, obscene language, etc. with no known suspects.
0	Identity Theft	Obtaining someone else's personal identifying information and using it to obtain credit, goods or services.	Someone obtains a credit card usi your S.S.N. or obtains phone serviusing your personal information.
0	Lost Property	When property is missing or lost.	Property that is missing, leaving items in restaurant, or missing from home.
0	Theft	Your property is taken without your permission. Property taken from an unlocked vehicle shall be filed under Theft From Vehicle. Property taken from an open garage is a Burglary, and you will need to contact the Police Department at (949) 644-3717 to report this crime. Theft with a loss value of over 5950 cannot be filed online.	Lawn ornaments, bicycle from yar purse from shopping cart, taking property from a building/residenc by someone that had permission t be there and took property without owners permission.
0	Theft from a Vehicle	Your property is taken without your permission from an unlocked vehicle. Property taken from a locked vehicle is Vehicle Burglary, and you will need to contact the Police Department at (949) 644-3717 to report this crime. Theft from a Vehicle with a loss value of over \$950 cannot be filed online.	CD's, Clothes, Books, Purse, Mone Garage Door Opener, etc.
0	Vandalism	The act of changing, modifying or defacing public or private property. Any damaged value of \$400 or more cannot be reported online, you must call the Police Department at (949) 644-3717 to report the vandalism.	Graffiti, knocking over mail box, throwing rock through windows, e

Neighborhood Watch – Crime Definitions

Part I Offenses

Criminal

a. Murder and non-negligent manslaughter

Homicide:

b. Manslaughter by negligence

The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Forcible Rape:

The rape of a female forcibly and against her will.

Robbery:

The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim

in fear

Aggravated

An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or

Assault: aggravated bodily injury.

Burglary: The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

Larceny-

The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession

Theft: or constructive possession of another.

NOTE: Burglary/Theft From Motor Vehicle (B/TFMV) is included in this category.

Motor

Vehicle Theft: The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

Arson:

Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another,

etc.

Criminal homicide, Forcible rape and Aggravated assault.



 - Statistics 1/1 4/29 (compared to 2019)
 - Part 1 crime down 14%
 - Burglary down 16%
 - Garage theft up 53%
- May update from Sara Verschueren
 - Burglary / theft from motor vehicles up
 - Garage burglary still high
 - Keep garage door closed as much as possible
 - Lock pedestrian door most common access
 - Lock door opener (if possible)
 - Lock bikes!

Neighborhood Watch Home Security Inspection Checklist



FRONT ENTRANCE	Yes	No	Comments
The front door has solid core construction			
The door has a peephole with a 190-degree view			
The deadbolt lock has a minimum 1-inch throw			
The strike plate is installed with a minimum of two 3-inch screws			
Glass or mail drop within 40 inches of the door – the door is equipped with a double-cylinder deadbolt (In case of an emergency, the key is always kept nearby.)			
The door lock is in good working order			
Driveway/pathway motion detector alert (should be used with a front screen or Dutch doors)			
Double Doors - have a bolt securing the top and bottom of the non-locking door			
The porch light automatically comes on from dusk to dawn			
The front of the home is equipped with a doorbell camera that allows communication through a smartphone

All strike plates are installed with a minimum of two 3-inch screws

Porch lights come on automatically from dusk to dawn			
All exterior door locks are in good working order			
All doors with exterior hinges are equipped with hinge protection			
French Doors - have a bolt securing the top and bottom of the non-locking door

The sliding glass door does not lift out of the track			
The lock is in proper working order			
There is a secondary lock or wooden dowel used to secure the door
